

### MULTIPLE LEVELS OF CARE

National Jewish Medical and Research Center provides a wide range of cost-effective clinical resources with specialized expertise in respiratory, allergic and immune diseases. Our approach is comprehensive, yet tailored to the individual needs of each patient, physician and payor. From office consultations to enhanced, multidisciplinary outpatient treatment services, National Jewish physicians provide optimal, comprehensive evaluation and treatment for children and adults. We also offer inpatient services for pediatric acute care patients and adults suffering from infectious diseases. All of our programs improve quality of life for our patients and reduce long-term treatment costs.

### NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED PHYSICIANS

The physicians at National Jewish are nationally recognized leaders in treating respiratory, allergic and immune diseases such as asthma, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), tuberculosis and lupus. Our approach is comprehensive, yet tailored to the individual needs of the patient, physician and payor.


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### IMPROVED OUTCOMES

## Outpatient Services/Levels of Care

### CONSULTATION/PRIMARY CARE REFERRALS

National Jewish physicians are an excellent resource for the first referral of a patient from a primary care physician. Our expertise can often help the referring physician develop an effective treatment plan with minimal testing and office visits. Office, telephone and on-line consultations are available to physicians in the following disciplines:

- Asthma
- Allergy
- Autoimmune diseases and immune deficiency disorders
- ENT
- Environmental and occupational health sciences
- Mycobacterial diseases
- Psychosocial and behavioral health
- Pulmonary medicine
- Vocal cord dysfunction

### ENHANCED OUTPATIENT TREATMENT PROGRAMS

Our Enhanced Outpatient Treatment Programs offer an intensive, multi-day program of evaluation, observation, education, monitoring and therapy tailored to the particular needs of each patient. These programs provide highly effective adult and pediatric treatment programs, in an outpatient setting, for difficult-to-manage patients of all ages with chronic respiratory, infectious, allergic or immune disorders. These programs are unique for each individual and are developed and provided by a team of individuals from several medical disciplines. Upon referral, the patient's health history is documented and the patient is scheduled with a National Jewish asthma/allergy specialist or pulmonary specialist within our Enhanced Outpatient Treatment Programs.

Once evaluation at National Jewish has begun, the medical and laboratory findings are combined with the input of our care team to design a specific plan of care, which optimizes control and stabilization of disease. These plans are designed to reduce the frequency and severity of exacerbations and long-term costs, and improve quality of life. Children and adults who enter our Enhanced Outpatient Treatment Programs do not require inpatient hospitalization, but are too sick to succeed in a conventional outpatient clinic environment.



**Regardless of the level of care required, from consultation to our Enhanced Outpatient Treatment Programs, our patients benefit from a broad range of clinical resources tailored to their needs. National Jewish staff works with patients, physicians and payors to determine the appropriate level of care necessary for success.**

## ASTHMA TREATMENT

National Jewish offers a range of treatment programs to meet the specific needs of adult and pediatric patients with mild to severe asthma. Our multidisciplinary approach is comprehensive, yet customized based on patients' needs and allows them to see a team of specialists in one location. Our programs range from clinical visits to multi-day programs consisting of evaluation, observation, education, monitoring and therapy.

### *Adult Asthma Services*

Our Outpatient Adult Asthma Clinic offers patients a multidisciplinary approach to the evaluation and management of their asthma. Our team of asthma specialists includes physicians who are leaders in allergy, immunology and pulmonary medicine. In concert with other health professionals, our physicians develop an individualized plan of care for physical assessment, respiratory therapy, medications, physical and occupational therapy, nutritional and psychosocial support and education. Upon discharge, a plan is developed that addresses the patient's ongoing needs that may be managed with the patient's primary care physician.

### *Pediatric Asthma Services*

Children are admitted to a treatment program based on the severity of their asthma and the level of difficulty in managing their disease: The Pediatric Outpatient Clinic or the Pediatric Day Program. The Pediatric Clinic is similar to more conventional approaches to the diagnosis and management of asthma in an outpatient setting. However, this program allows for a multidisciplinary approach, if needed, to manage the child's illness. The Pediatric Day Program is a comprehensive program in which patients and their families participate in appointments and therapeutic activities throughout the day. It may occur in one day or across the span of several days. It combines the intensity of an inpatient hospital stay with the cost savings of outpatient treatment. The National Jewish team consists of an attending physician, nurse, allergy fellow or physician assistant, behavioral clinician, rehabilitation therapist and possibly care providers from other disciplines such as speech, nutrition, immunology and pulmonary.



## ALLERGY AND IMMUNOLOGY TREATMENT

### *Allergy Programs*

Providing comprehensive patient care services for all ages in allergy and immunology, we specialize in the diagnosis and treatment of a wide variety of allergic conditions including:

- Allergic conjunctivitis
- Allergic contact dermatitis
- Allergic rhinitis (hay fever)
- Anaphylaxis
- Angioedema
- Asthma
- Atopic dermatitis (eczema)
- Chronic sinusitis
- Drug and food allergy
- Eosinophilic disorders including:  
*hypereosinophilic syndrome, eosinophilic pneumonia, eosinophilic esophagitis and gastritis, allergic bronchopulmonary aspergillosis, Churg-Strauss syndrome, and pulmonary hypersensitivity disorders*
- Stinging insect allergy
- Urticaria

Our physicians have a strong interest in each of these areas and are familiar with the specialized diagnostic and/or therapeutic procedures, such as immunotherapy (rush, cluster, conventional), food challenges, aspirin and drug desensitization, that allows for an efficient approach to a diagnosis and subsequent development of a management plan.

### *Immunology Programs*

We see patients with adult-type immunodeficiency disorders including:

- CD4 deficiency
- Chronic granulomatous disease
- Chronic mucocutaneous candidiasis
- Common variable immunodeficiency
- Complement deficiency and other rare immunodeficiency conditions
- Hyper IgM syndrome
- IgA deficiency
- Isolated antibody deficiency
- Lupus
- Rheumatology

Our allergy and immunology specialists have expertise with various forms of vasculitis and autoimmune disorders including small and large vessel vasculitis, Wegner's granulomatosis, cryoimmunoglobulinemia and others.

### *Food Allergy Diagnosis and Management Services*

National Jewish was the first medical institution to routinely perform food challenges, and has consistently been a nationally recognized leader in evaluating, diagnosing, educating and treating patients with food allergies. We provide single-day consultations, multiple outpatient visits or inpatient care, if needed. Competitively priced, the evaluation includes:

- Allergen skin and laboratory testing
- Dietary evaluation and advice
- Food challenges
- Patient education
- Patient visit follow-up
- Treatment approaches for children, adolescents and adults

National Jewish's team of physicians, nurses, dieticians and psychosocial clinicians have years of experience working with patients with food allergies.



## PULMONARY TREATMENT

### *Pulmonary Programs*

The pulmonary services at National Jewish provide a whole-person approach to both adults and children with chronic pulmonary diseases. We treat patients with a variety of disorders including:

- Asthma
- COPD (emphysema, chronic bronchitis)
- Cystic fibrosis
- Interstitial lung disease
- Occupational lung disease
- Sarcoidosis
- Sleep disorders
- Tuberculosis

Using a multidisciplinary approach, we are able to evaluate the various factors that may be affecting the diagnosis and management of a patient’s physical, emotional, rehabilitative and psychological needs. Our pulmonary rehabilitation program is often a part of the patient’s treatment at National Jewish. Pulmonary rehabilitation includes medical management, patient education, rehabilitation and physical conditioning, nutrition counseling, and consideration of psychosocial/behavioral health needs. Our patients experience a better understanding of their disease, increased energy and endurance, improved ability to participate in activities of daily living and reduced need for hospitalization.

### *Sleep Evaluation, Diagnostics and Treatment*

The Sleep Center at National Jewish is Colorado’s largest sleep disorders center. The Center utilizes advanced technology to provide both comprehensive diagnosis and a full range of therapies for patients suffering from:

- Obstructive Sleep Apnea
- Narcolepsy
- Insomnia
- Other sleep disorders
- Restless Leg Syndrome

We offer two National Jewish Sleep Centers located in Denver and Littleton.

## ENVIRONMENTAL AND OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH SCIENCES



Our multidisciplinary team provides access to a unique staff of professionals consisting of board-certified occupational, pulmonary and allergy physicians, nurses, laboratory-based scientists, epidemiologists, certified industrial hygienists, certified respirator fit technicians and support staff. We collaborate with employers, labor, workers, educators, attorneys, community members and government agencies on issues related to healthcare and industrial and agricultural environments. Our services include:

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## Diagnostic Services

Diagnostic and Ancillary Services are important elements to National Jewish's Clinical and Enhanced Outpatient Treatment Programs and are used in various combinations to meet the needs of individual patients.


### *Pulmonary Physiology Testing*

Leading-edge technology and staff can provide a precise evaluation of lung function for clinical and research patients. Specialized services performed in our laboratories include body plethysmography, exercise metabolic studies, arterial blood gas analysis, bronchial challenges, bronchoscopy, rhinolaryngoscopy, rhinometry, pharyngometry and oscillimetry studies.

### *Lung Imaging*

Our vast experience with chronic respiratory diseases, coupled with state-of-the-art digital diagnostic equipment enables our highly trained radiologists to support our clinicians in effectively establishing the correct diagnosis. Our Picture Archiving and Communications System (PACS) allows for rapid distribution of the images and results to clinicians, both at National Jewish and referring physicians, in a timely manner. Our radiologic services include: routine diagnostic digital x-ray and fluoroscopy, multi-slice CT scanner, bone densitometry, nuclear medicine, ultrasound and bronchoscopy utilizing fluoroscopy.

## Ancillary Services

### *Adult Psychosocial and Behavioral Health*

National Jewish is a leader in integrated medical and psychosocial evaluation and treatment of chronic illnesses. Our services include:

- Behavioral therapy for individuals, couples and families
- Brief psychotherapy
- Cognitive and neuropsychological evaluations
- Parenting education
- Psychiatric medication
- Psychosocial evaluations
- Relaxation/stress reduction training
- Specialized therapy groups

From evaluation to intensive ongoing support, we help patients and families understand the impact of chronic illness on their lives and enhance their ability to live normal, healthy lives. Board-certified psychiatrists, licensed psychologists, and clinical social workers staff our adult clinics.

### *Pediatric Behavioral Health*

The pediatric behavioral health team at National Jewish consists of experienced social workers, psychologists, child psychiatrists and creative arts therapists who provide an array of mental health services to children and their families to assess and treat childhood and adolescent psychological and behavioral problems. The National Jewish pediatric behavioral health program has gained a national reputation for treating children with chronic illness. The same exceptional behavioral health treatment services or expertise offered to our chronically ill patients are available to all children suffering from behavioral problems that concern parents, physicians and insurers.

### *Patient Education*

Patient education is individualized for each patient and their families who come to National Jewish. Through individual and group sessions and various types of educational materials, patients learn more about their medical problems and self-management techniques. Utilizing this knowledge, patients are better able to participate in the management of their disease and reduce unnecessary physician and emergency room visits.

### *Nutrition*

National Jewish offers nutritional evaluations and dietary advice for patients. This may include elimination diets and patient education on topics including the development of a treatment plan, psychosocial evaluation and support in maintaining a treatment plan. National Jewish has a team of physicians, nurses and dieticians with years of experience working with patients.



### *Rehabilitation*

Rehabilitation services offer physical, occupational and speech therapy for children and adults. Our staff includes physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech language pathologists, recreation therapists and exercise specialists. Facilities and qualified staff are available for patients requiring rehabilitation for the following disorders:

- **Arthritis**
- **Developmental delays affecting function and learning**
- **Neurological problems including swallowing disorders**
- **Orthopedic problems and injuries**
- **Pediatric feeding evaluations and treatment**
- **Post-operative rehabilitation**
- **Routine neck and back problems**
- **Strokes**
- **Work injuries**
- **Voice disorders**

Patients who are deconditioned due to chronic disease, injury or illness are evaluated and started on a safe program to improve fitness and function. Our department also offers aquatic therapy for individuals and community group classes in the largest warm water pool in Denver. Our goal is to assist the patient through evaluation, treatment and education to lead a full and satisfying life. Physicians and allied healthcare providers may refer only local patients directly into the rehabilitation program.

## Clinical Reference Laboratories

The Clinical Reference Laboratories at National Jewish provide cutting edge and unique assays in the areas of: immunology and flow cytometry, complement, infectious disease pharmacokinetics, mycobacteriology and clinical trials. The laboratories are accredited by CAP, CLIA, JCAHO, Florida, New York and Pennsylvania.

### LABORATORY SERVICES

#### *Diagnostic Immunology and Flow Cytometry*

Offers comprehensive panels of assays, which measure and determine the functional activities of antibodies, immunoglobulins, neutrophils and lymphocytes. Assays are also available to evaluate phagocytic activity including chemotaxis, oxidative metabolism and bactericidal response to microorganisms.

#### *Diagnostic Complement*

Offers testing to determine the level and function of all complement components and split products. The laboratory offers quantitation of complement activation in vitro and in vivo, and has worked extensively with pharmaceutical and biomaterials corporations in pre-clinical and clinical trials.

#### *Infectious Disease Pharmacokinetics (IDPL)*

IDPL offers analytical chemistry and pharmacokinetic modeling services with emphasis in infectious diseases. Study designs are routinely customized to meet individual researchers criteria. IDPL offers comprehensive antimycobacterial, antifungal and anti-HIV drug serum concentrations utilizing HPLC and GC assays. IDPL also provides PK data analysis and has been providing services for pre-clinical and Phase I-IV clinical trials for over 15 years.

#### *Mycobacteriology Laboratory*

Offers bacteriological support for clinical trials to evaluate the efficacy of new drugs in the treatment, prevention of tuberculosis and *M. avium* infections, as well as preclinical evaluation of experimental compounds against these infections. The mycobacteriology laboratory has developed drug susceptibility tests with new agents in accordance with FDA requirements and evaluation of new devices and systems for cultivation.



## Frequently Asked Questions

### ANSWERS FOR PHYSICIANS AND ALLIED HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS

#### **How do I refer a patient to National Jewish?**

Referring a patient to National Jewish is simple. Just call our toll free numbers dedicated to physicians (1-800-652-9555) and case managers (1-800-573-5864). You will speak directly to a specially trained respiratory nurse who can offer consultation and answer your specific questions. This registered nurse will conduct a brief medical intake to initiate the referral and determine the appropriate level of care for your patient.

#### **Do National Jewish physicians only treat the most severe patients?**

The physicians at National Jewish provide all levels of care for treating patients with mild to severe disease. Most patients are seen and treated in our outpatient clinic. These patients often present a history of frequent emergency room visits and hospitalizations. For the moderate to severe or complex patient, an intensive outpatient intervention program may be more appropriate. Our goal is to educate and teach all our patients to manage their disease and to improve their quality of life.

#### **How will treatment at National Jewish differ from treatment in my patient's hometown?**

Patients who travel to National Jewish often have failed traditional treatment approaches. While at National Jewish, patients are temporarily removed from their environment and daily routine so they are able to focus full attention on their disease. A team of National Jewish specialists who may include physicians, nurses, dieticians, psychosocial clinicians and rehabilitation therapists will work together to develop a patient treatment plan specific to each patient. The evaluation summary, recommendations and treatment plan are provided to the referring physician as well as to the patient.
