DOM-MOOR Microgrants are back!

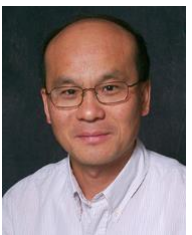
Emerging from our pandemic hiatus, our Clinical & Translational Research Section (led by Dr. Lisa Maier) and our Basic Science Section (led by Dr. Hong Wei Chu) are very pleased to announce the return of our MOOR microgrants! **The deadline for all applications is September 10**, with projected start date of October 1.

Clinical & Translational Research Section:



- \$5K Microgrant (N=3). Provide pilot money to help promote a promising clinical or translational research project. Instructor, Assistant and Associate Professor faculty are eligible to apply. \$5,000 each, to be fully spent within 12 months.
- 10K Team Microgrant (N=1). Similar to our 5K microgrant, but with an emphasis on collaboration.
- \$2K Travel (N=2). We will resume travel support to conferences and special workshops as safety and policy allow.

Basic Science Section:



- \$20K Team Microgrant (N=1). Provide funding to cover the experimental costs for preparing and submitting a large-scale collaborative research grant application (e.g., P01, U19, DOD). Eligibility: Faculty at any level (Instructor to full Professor).
 - \$2K Travel (N=3) Promote learning novel research methods and technologies outside Colorado to enhance research projects and grant applications. Eligibility: Junior faculty, Postdoctoral fellows.

Response to COVID-19 Vaccines in People with Chronic Conditions
 Sponsor: Investigator funded

Do you have a patient age 18 and older who is 90-180 days out from their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine and has a chronic disease?
 Our researchers are working to understand the short-term and long-term antibody response to COVID-19 vaccines in people with chronic respiratory diseases such as asthma, COPD, and ILD, as well as other chronic diseases.

This study consists of 2-4 study visits over the course of 12 months.

LOGIN.gov – New! – Nancy Wilson



NIH and other Federal sites are changing to a single sign-on site known as LOGIN.gov. This includes the eRA Commons site. For NIH this will be mandatory in September, so we recommend setting this up on your system, this month.

What's happening?

NCBI is transitioning from using local account passwords (the password you created at NCBI) for logging into NCBI to using only 3rd-party logins (your username and password from Google, Login.gov, ORCiD, your university or research institution account, etc.).

What about my account data?

This change will NOT affect the data in your account, such as your MyBibliography, SciENcv, or submission data. You will also keep your NCBI Username, you just won't be able to log in with it anymore.

Why is this happening?

NIH, NLM, and NCBI take your privacy and security very seriously. Transitioning to 3rd parties who have industry-standard security practices ensures that you have the highest level of security and enables us to focus our resources on improving your experience once you log in.

What do I need to do?

We suggest linking at least one 3rd-party login to your account now and starting to use it to log into NCBI. If you have any questions or encounter issues, you can always email us at info@ncbi.nlm.nih.gov.
