New NIH Pilot Program Supporting Women Scientists – *Lindsay Markham, MBA, CCMP*



I have some exciting news for our faculty. ORWH, in partnership with the National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases (NIAMS), will launch a new pilot program. Team Science Leadership Scholar Program (LSP) to Advance Women. Health (Autoimmunity and Immune-Mediated Diseases). This program will support and train women scholars by helping them acquire and hone team science leadership and mentoring skills. LSP will develop a cohort of women scientists who can lead complex, high impact research programs in academia, industry, and the public health sectors. It also aims to create a framework for teaching mid-career scientists the skills they would need to be successful mentors.
