PROGRAM AIMS

The Program's Aims are as follows:

- Providing state-of-the-art clinical training in pediatric allergic and immunologic diseases including primary immunodeficiency, asthma, rhinitis, sinusitis, drug allergy, food allergy, eosinophilic esophagititis, urticaria, anaphylaxis, and atopic dermatitis. Although focused primarily on pediatrics, fellows are also cross-trained in the treatment of adult allergy and immunology as well.
- Developing a comprehensive and in-depth understanding of the biological and physiological basis of allergy and immunology to facility expertise in the management of complex clinical disorders and serve as a foundation for a career in academic medicine or clinical practice.
- The Allergy-Immunology Fellowship program is designed to train expert practitioners in the subspecialty of allergy immunology as manifested by competency in 6 domains outline by the ACGME.
