	Internal Medicine Core: Provision of non-surgical treatment of general medical problems seen in the adult patient population	Requires successful completion of an ACGME or AOA accredited residency in Internal Medicine
	Allergy & Immunology Core: Admission, history & physical, evaluation, diagnosis, provision of treatment, consultation, and management for patients presenting with allergic or immunologic conditions or disorders. Procedures include skin testing; food, allergen, and irritant challenges; patch testing and interpretation; rush immunotherapy; allergen, and drug desensitization	Requires successful completion of an ACGME or AOA accredited fellowship in Allergy & Immunology Physicians must order at least ten Immunotherapy, or drug/food challenges every two years based on clinical FTE
Non-Core Procedures:		
	Fiberoptic Laryngoscopy	Requires documentation of training
	Rhinoscopy	Requires documentation of training
	Skin Biopsy	Requires documentation of training
	Mild to Moderate Sedation	Requires current ACLS and adult moderate sedation certification
