Dear Valued Client,

Effective 12/19/2025, the Mycobacteriology Laboratory will offer susceptibility testing for Mycobacterium tuberculosis complex using the following drugs:

First-line drugs: rifampin, isoniazid, ethambutol, and pyrazinamide

Second-line drugs: amikacin, capreomycin, streptomycin, linezolid, moxifloxacin, ethionamide, and bedaquiline

Additional drugs available upon request include levofloxacin, ofloxacin, and rifabutin.

Testing for cycloserine and clofazimine is temporarily unavailable; however, the laboratory is actively working to restore this service. Susceptibility testing for p-amino salicylic acid will no longer be performed.
