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DENVER — Arthritis is the most common cause of disability across the United States, and in Colorado alone, there are approximately 800,000 adults with arthritis. National Jewish Health and the Arthritis Foundation together will be conducting *Arthritis Answers: What's New in Rheumatology Treatment*, a half day seminar to help those living with arthritis on Saturday, March 14, 2009.
