

Real Estate and Construction Industries Dinner-Dance raises \$1.4 million for National Jewish Health

Denver, CO — [Bruce E. Mosler](#), Co-Chairman of the Board of Cushman & Wakefield Inc., was the evening's honoree as he was presented the National Jewish Health® 2010 Humanitarian Award on December 11 during the Real Estate and Construction Industries' Winter's Eve Gala at the Grand Hyatt New York. The event raised \$1.4 million to establish the Bruce E. and Wendy F. Mosler Fund for Treatment and Research of Pediatric and Adult Asthma. [Jonathan L.
