

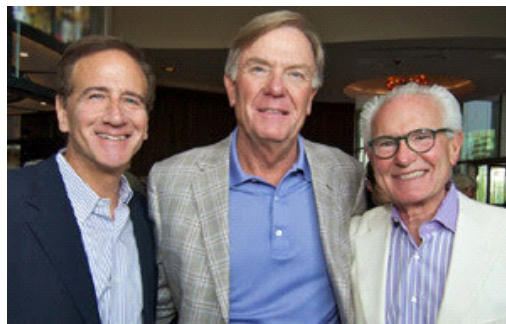
Two-Day Kunsberg Classic at Shanahan's and The Sanctuary Raises \$210,000 for Chronically Ill Childre
