Fundraising Event for College Basketball Fans at Denver Cable Center

Sports lovers will gather to watch college basketball and support National Jewish Health for the 10th annual Hoops & Hoopla fundraising event presented by Greiner Electric on April 6 at the Cable Center in Denver. Proceeds benefit Kunsberg School, a free kindergarten through eighth-grade school for chronically ill children located on the National Jewish Health campus. Doors open at 3:30 p.m. and the first game tips off at 4 p.m.

Kunsberg students receive care and learn to manage their illnesses from three nurses and National Jewish Health pediatricians. They eat nutritious meals, exercise daily, and practice positive social interaction. The students learn in small classes from teachers with advanced degrees using the latest educational technology tools; they demonstrate their knowledge by showing steady improvement on the CSAP test and outpacing their peers in similar schools. Upon graduation, Kunsberg students have the skills to lead healthy, productive, meaningful and active lives.
