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NEW YORK, NY — The Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai and National Jewish Health, the nation's leading respiratory hospital based in Denver, today announced the official opening of the Mount Sinai – National Jewish Health Respiratory Institute at Mount Sinai's campus in Manhattan. The partnership creates a strong, integrated program for diagnosis and treatment of respiratory illness and lung disease, including asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), and interstitial lung disease (ILD).

The Respiratory Institute also draws on Mount Sinai's programs in personalized medicine, genomics, and data-driven clinical protocols to enhance the quality and outcomes of the respiratory disease practice.
