

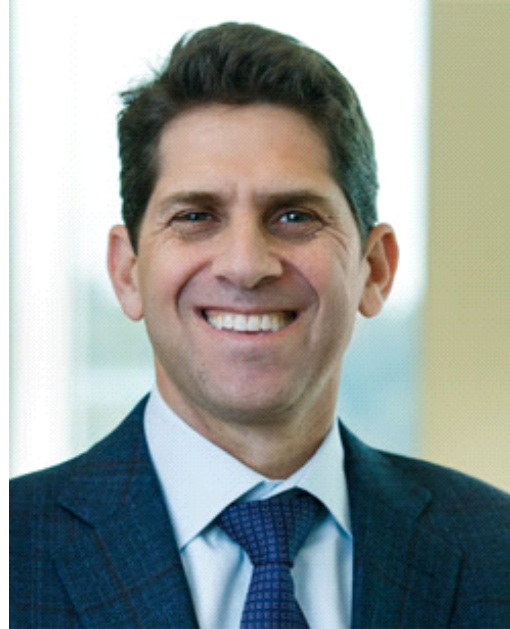
Pulmonologist Dr. Matthew Koslow Joins National Jewish Health
